We award academic fellowships and project grants, sponsor professional development activities, and foster a vibrant network of more than 700 Switzer Fellows working to solve today's environmental challenges.

Celebrating the Network



The past year brought new faces to the Switzer staff and board and new opportunities to gather as a community of fellows.

Following the departure of long-time staff member Erin Lloyd, we welcomed Maya Higgins as the foundation's <u>new Program Manager</u> in April. Maya is a trained facilitator, mediator, educator, organizer, and network weaver, and she brings extensive experience with facilitating retreats focused on cultivating belonging, working across difference, and building community for fellowship and leadership development programs. As Program Manager, Maya leads recruitment and selection for the Switzer Fellowship, designs and hosts retreats and professional development, and administers the post-fellowship grant programs.

We also welcomed two new members to the foundation's Board of Trustees in July. Dawn Chávez and Donna Vorhees are Switzer Fellows alums who bring new expertise and experience in environmental health, leadership, and organizational development to contribute to the foundation's strategy and governance. Dawn Chávez is a <u>2003 Switzer Fellow</u> and current Executive Director of the Environmental Leadership Program, a peer fellowship program that provides environmental and social change leaders with support to launch new endeavors, achieve new successes, and rise to new leadership positions. Donna Vorhees is a <u>1992 Switzer Fellow</u> and past member of the Fellows Advisory Committee; she currently leads the Health Effect Institute's work in providing impartial science about potential community exposures and health effects associated with energy production.

Planning and hosting the Switzer Network's first cross-cohort gathering was a major focus of our program work this past year. We worked with a committee of seven Switzer Fellows to plan "<u>Fellowship to</u> <u>Friendship: A Switzer Network Celebration</u>," held in Puerto Rico in March 2025. The gathering's purpose was to create authentic, supportive connections between fellows across cohorts, geographies, and expertise, while encouraging shared learning, respectful engagement, and meaningful interaction with the people, place, and environment of Puerto Rico. An intentional planning process grounded in shared leadership and purpose led to a deeply meaningful and connective gathering.

Looking ahead, we will continue to implement priorities that emerged from the foundation's <u>strategic</u> <u>review</u> by planning for geographic expansion of the fellowship program. We will celebrate the foundation's 40th anniversary by extending eligibility to students at universities outside California and New England through substantial changes to our outreach strategy, application format, and review process.
